PUNE: Amrita University's E-learning Platform A-VIEW (Amrita Virtual Interactive E-Learning World) was launched for schools in Maharashtra here on January 4, at Amrita Vidyalayam, Nigdi during Sri Mata Amritanandamayi's program.
